Areas Noam Needs Support

-  Social anxiety — struggles to initiate or read social cues
-  Literal, black-and-white thinking — working on seeing the gray
-  Writing is tiring — writes slowly, loses steam, and may need modified tasks
-  Recess and unstructured time can be hard — needs social support then
-  Does best when things are clear, concrete, and predictable
-  Benefits from proactive accommodations, gentle support, and encouragement to speak up for himself

Helping Noam Thrive

-  Clear expectations and structure — when he knows the rules, he can follow them
-  Visual aids, checklists, and step-by-step processes — When he knows what to expect, he feels less overwhelmed.
-  Modified writing load — He know all the answers, but writing them takes time
-  Support during social times like recess or lunch
-  Encouragement to self-advocate, even when it feels hard
-  Opportunities to shine in math, science, and deep thinking
-  Positive, gentle adults who believe in me and help me believe in myself
-  A calm space when he needs to reset or think things through
-  Reminders that it's okay to ask for help
